

Bridging activities for Media Studies at Latymer

AS Level students are required to study a range of set products across a variety of media forms (including radio, computer games, newspapers and television) specified by the exam board (OCR). The suggested bridging activities below have been designed to take advantage of the summer break to watch/listen/read as much as possible ahead of starting the new course when you might have a bit more free time. The more familiar you are with the set products, the more confident you will feel in your lessons. You may choose to work through the list below or choose a couple of activities to start with.

1. WRITE

Make sure you include: the title of the film or TV drama; the channel; a short synopsis (or plot summary); the genre; key characters; summary of the visual style; an explanation of what you think audiences will enjoy (or not!) when watching the episode. Word count: 500 words max.
