

'Great Expectations' – Answer Sheet

1.	Wax candles 1 mark
2.	The room is large Wax candles are expensive (history-lovers may know this...) She has a dressing room She was dressed in rich materials She has jewels Or any other evidence that is text-based and seems relevant to wealth 2 pieces of evidence for 2 marks
3.	She has only one shoe on (has not finished dressing) 1 mark
4.	She reminds him of a ghostly waxwork at a fair Her dressing room is disorderly She is wearing a wedding dress and has clearly been wearing it for some time She has withered inside her dress She looks like a skeleton She is rich but everything that's supposed to be white has turned yellow She is dressed like a bride but it's not her wedding day 3 pieces of relevant, text-based evidence for 3 marks
5.	She has been wearing the dress for a long time and has lost weight (own words) 1 mark
6.	Two objects: a waxwork and a skeleton She is frightening and ghastly; she seems strange and unreal 1 mark for BOTH pieces of evidence (no mark if only one is given) 2 marks for clear effect
7.	Afraid, disturbed, unsettled or any two adjectives that seem suitable to you 2 marks
8.	"Avoiding her eyes", "I was not afraid of telling the enormous lie" 2 marks
9.	True True False 3 marks
10.	Prominent – stand out, significant/important Looking-glass – mirror Ghastly – horrible, deathly Or synonyms that seem appropriate to you 3 marks
11.	Possible evidence: (1 mark each for a relevant quotation/evidence, 1 mark for each convincing explanation, to give 4 in total.) Both the watch and the clock have stopped and she has not tried to fix them She is dressed as if she's on her wedding day but she is an old woman Everything that should be white has yellowed with age She says her heart is broken so this might be why she does not move on Or any evidence and explanation that seems valid to you, with 2 marks for each explanation – do not award 2 marks if the evidence works but the explanation does not consider effect.
